<u>Hospitality.</u> <u>Preparing Your Home for the Holiday</u>

1 Peter 4:8-9

Above all things have intense *and* unfailing love for one another, for love covers a multitude of sins. Practice hospitality to one another. [Be hospitable, be a lover of strangers, with brotherly affection for the unknown guests, the foreigners, the poor, and all others who come your way who are of Christ's body.] And do it ungrudgingly (cordially and graciously, without complaining but as representing Him).

Basic Hospitality Tips for the Gal Who Struggles with Hospitality:

- The Apostle Paul teaches us that we are to pursue Hospitality. (Romans 12:13, 1Titus 3:2) We think hospitality is just cooking a meal or hosting a party. It is much more than those things. It's a heart issue and a hands issue. The Greek word for Hospitality is philoxenia. Literally this means "love of strangers" Reflect a moment and ask yourself: Have I been practicing hospitality the way Jesus taught? Am I willing to follow his example and obey him? BE INTENTIONAL

Hospitality VS. Entertaining/Performing:

In the book <u>Still Living By Faith</u>, Annie May Lewis writes, "Entertaining says, 'I want to impress you with my beautiful home, my clever decorating, and my gourmet cooking.' Hospitality says, 'This is not mine. It is a gift from God and I'll use it as He desires."

Here are 10 ways to HOST instead of ENTERTAIN so you can begin mastering the art of Christian hospitality, especially as you enter a season filled with friends and family in your home:

- Pray. Ask God to allow you to be a blessing to others. Ask Him to help you touch the people who enter your home. Take the focus off yourself - It's Biblical!
- Keep it simple. Hosting is about the experience, not the presentation. Prepare a meal that allows you time to visit, not one that takes you away from your company.
- Make a list one week in advance. HAVE A PLAN.
- Try to do EVERYTHING before your guests arrive (ie...set the table, make coffee, put ice in water glasses, place appetizers...)
- 3. Be authentic. Remove the masks and let the people see the true you. Warts and all.
- 4. Request a Dish. Ask guests to bring something.
- 5. Announce the desire to be informal.

- 6. Smile, Tell Stories, Listen well. Make your guests feel valued and loved. Keep it casual and relaxed. Table conversation starters.
- 7. Use your regular dishes. The more formal the china the more formal the setting
- 8. Ask for help.
- 9. Show pictures they stimulate stories and encourage conversation.
- 10. Prepare the Kids. Hospitality teaches your children so include them. If your kids know the boundaries and expectations things will be easier for everyone.
